


Helping States Support Families Caring for an Aging America

The initiative involves states committed to developing policies or programs to support family caregivers and address the challenges of an aging population. These states will develop strategies to assist family caregivers and potential approaches include:

- Creating uniform policies
- Providing critical training
- Rethinking how to identify and track family caregivers
- Expanding access to respite and adult day care

- Provide routine support to reduce caregiver burnout.
- Create an improved process for the consumer.
- Provide more consistent service delivery across Iowa.
